Internet Governance Forum 2011

- Nairobi, Kenya on 27-30 September 2011
 - Sixth annual IGF
 - Over 2000 on-site participants (including 125 governments)
 - 823 remote participants from 47 hubs
 - 122 workshops and other meetings
- RIPE NCC participated individually and as part of the Number Resource Organization (NRO)
 - NRO organised two workshops

NRO Workshops

- Enhancing Understanding: Facilitating Internet Governance Through Openness and Transparency
 - Good discussion on ways to improve understanding between stakeholders
- Understanding IPv6 Deployment and Transition
 - Focus on capacity building, particularly in developing regions
